Fall Classic

GENERAL RULES

1. All exhibitors must exhibit their own animals unless they have specific permission from the show management or have more than one animal being shown at that time in order to receive TJLA points. Substitute exhibitors must be of eligible TJLA age.
2. Premiums will not be awarded to breed or reserve breed champions if they are not present for the Championship drive.
3. All livestock and exhibitors are free to leave after they show with the exception of the above.
4. Adjustments in class breaks will be made at the discretion of the show management.
5. The decision of the show management on any matter is final.
6. Showmanship exhibitors must be members of the TJLA.
7. Showmanship exhibitors must enter and exhibit the animal that they use for showmanship in the show.
8. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to enter the correct age division for showmanship. Members entered in the wrong age division will forfeit their points.
9. No health papers required for Texas exhibitors.
10. No fan stands will be allowed in the aisles in the cattle barns. Fans in the barn must be hung from brackets.
11. All points earned at the Fall Classic will double in both state wide and regional competition. Showmanship competition is not double points.
12. Only animals entered in show A may enter Show B.
13. Showmanship ages:
 - Peewee: 7 Years of Age and Under
 - Junior: 8-11 Years of Age
 - Intermediate: 12- 14 Years of Age
 - Senior: 15 Years of Age and Older(All age categories are based upon the age of the exhibitor on September 1, 2011)
14. No refund on entries.

Progress Steer Show Rules Sunday, November 27, 2011 8:00 a.m.

1. Steer exhibitors will turn in their own weight cards.
2. Steers will be classified. There will be a 5% weigh back in the first show.
3. Progress steers will be shown in 16 breed divisions. They will be broken into weight classes as numbers permit.
4. Any steer which cannot be handled by the showman will be removed from the ring.
5. Steers must be shown by the owner unless the exhibitor has more than one animal in the same class. Substitute exhibitors must be of eligible TJLA age.
6. Animals must be exhibited in the first show in order to exhibit in the second show.
7. Texas exhibitors only. No health papers required.
8. All points earned will double in both state wide and regional competition.

9. Steers which are classified out of one breed will be exhibited as AOB's or ABC's. The decision of the classifiers is final.
10. If a steer weighs out in show A, it may show in show B.
11. No change of the major color pattern of any steer will be allowed.
12. Progress steers must weigh 726 pounds or more.
13. A steer that is shown in the showmanship contest must be exhibited by that exhibitor in the regular show.
14. All exhibitors must exhibit their own animals unless they have specific permission from the show management or have more than one animal being shown at the same time. Substitute exhibitors must be of eligible TJLA age.

Prospect Steer Show Rules Saturday, November 26, 2011 2:30 P.M.

1. In order to be eligible to show in the Fall Classic Prospect Steer Show, a steer must weigh 725 pounds or less.
2. Prospect steer show exhibitors will turn in their own weight card. There will be a 5% weigh back.
3. Prospect Steers will be classified.
4. Prospect steers will be shown in three divisions: American, British, and Exotic. They will be broken into weight classes within those divisions as numbers permit.
5. Points will be given for Prospect Show A&B. Points will count double in both state wide and regional competition.
6. A steer that is shown in the showmanship contest must be exhibited by that exhibitor in the regular show.

Town of Refugio Heifer Show Rules Heifer Show Sponsored by the Town of Refugio

American Heifer Shows - Friday, November 25, 2011 8:00 A.M.
British Heifer Shows - Friday, November 25, 2011 at the conclusion of American Heifer Show.
Continental Heifer Shows- Saturday, November 26, 2011 8:00 A.M.

1. Cattle eligible to be shown in the Fall Classic heifer show must be of the same percentage as cattle eligible to be shown at the Texas major shows if there is a division of competition for that breed. If there is not a division of competition for that breed, then the cattle must be of the same percentage as cattle eligible to be shown at the breed's junior national show.
2. Heifers will compete in the 26 breed format. There will be a breed division for each of the following breeds: ABC, Angus, AOB, ARB, Beefmaster, Braford, Brangus, Braunvieh, Grey Brahman, Red Brahman, Red Brangus, Charolais, Chianina, Hereford, Low Line Angus, Limousin, Maine Anjou, Miniature Hereford, ORB, Polled Hereford, Red Angus, Santa Gertrudis, Shorthorn, Simbrah,

- Simbravieh, and Simmental.
3. Original registration in the individual exhibitor's name will be verified at check-in.
4. An exception to the above is those exhibitors who are scramble heifer recipients. In this case, the exhibitor must present a copy of the original registration papers along with a letter or documentation from the show that awarded the scramble certificate.
5. Only heifers entered in show one may enter the second show.
6. There will be a Grand, Reserve Grand, and 3rd Overall Champion American Heifer; Grand, Reserve Grand, and 3rd Overall British Heifer; Grand, Reserve Grand, and 3rd Overall Continental Heifer as well as breed and reserve breed champions.
7. No heifers older than May 1, 2009 will be eligible to show.
8. Heifers will be divided by age.
9. Showmanship exhibitors must be members of the TCCA Heifer division.
10. Fall Classic Heifer Classes:
 - Class 1: April 1-August 31, 2011
 - Class 2: January 1 - March 31, 2011
 - Class 3: October 1 - December 31, 2010
 - Class 4: July 1 - September 30, 2010
 - Class 5: April 1 - June 30, 2010
 - Class 6: January 1 - March 31, 2010
 - Class 7: October 1 - December 31, 2009
 - Class 8: May 1 - September 30, 2009
11. All points earned at the Fall Classic will count double in both the state wide and regional TJLA competition.
12. Adjustments in class breaks will be made at the discretion of the show management.
13. A heifer that is shown in the showmanship contest must be exhibited by that exhibitor in the regular show.

Lamb Show Rules Lamb Show A - Friday, November 25, 2011 Immediately Following Official TCLA Showmanship Show Show B - Saturday, November 26, 2011 9:00 A.M.

1. Lambs will be shown in the four (4) TCLA breed divisions: Southdown, Finewool, Finewool Cross, and Medium Wool plus Haired Sheep.
2. Lambs will be divided by weight within those breed divisions. There are pre-set weight breaks:
 - Southdowns
 - 88 and Under
 - 89 - 97
 - 98- 108
 - 109- 119
 - 120 and Above
 - Fine Wools
 - 103 and Under
 - 104-115
 - 116 and Above
 - Fine Wool Crosses
 - 102 and Under
 - 103-110

3. All lambs will be slick shorn.
4. Exhibitors will turn in their weight cards at the time listed on the schedule.
5. Lambs weighing out will be disqualified.
6. There will be a five pound weigh-back in show A and a five pound weigh-back in Show B.
7. May show ewes or wethers.
8. A lamb must be entered in the first show in order to be exhibited in the second show.
9. Texas exhibitors only. No health papers required.
10. Exhibitors may not sell an entry that was purchased in their name to another exhibitor.
11. No refunds on entries.
12. A lamb that is shown in the showmanship contest must be exhibited by that exhibitor in the regular show.
13. All points earned at the Fall Classic will be doubled in both the state wide and regional TJLA points.
14. Lambs will be stalled on a first come/ first served basis.
15. Showmanship exhibitors must be members of TCLA.
16. Lambs will be checked for ringworm.
17. No painting of lambs.

Swine Show A Friday, November 25, 2011

**Swine Show B Will be Held on Saturday,
November 26, 2011 9:00 A.M.**

1. Texas exhibitors only.
2. No health papers required.
3. Six breed format: Duroc, Hamps, Crosses, Yorks, and Light OPB's (Chesters & Landraces), Dark OPB's (Berks & Chinas).
4. Barrows and gilts show together.
5. No boars over 125 lbs.
6. 10 lb weigh back in the first show and 15 lb in the second show. No tolerance other than the designated weigh-back.
7. Swine classes will be divided by weight within each breed division according to the numbers entered.
8. Showmanship exhibitors must be members of TCPA.
9. Showmanship will have a \$5.00 jackpot fee that will be collected at the gate the day of the showmanship show.
10. Showmanship ages:
Peewee: 7 Years of Age and Under
Junior: 8-11 Years of Age
Intermediate: 12- 14 Years of Age
Senior: 15 Years of Age and Older
(All age categories are based upon the age of the exhibitor on September 1, 2011.)
11. Pigs must be exhibited by the owner. The only exception is if the owner has more than one pig in the class or more than one animal being shown somewhere else at the show. Substitute exhibitors must be of eligible TJLA age.
12. Each hog must have been entered and exhibited in the first show in order to exhibit in the second show.
13. Animals weighing out will not be allowed to show in Ring B.

14. Stalled on a first come/ first served basis.
15. Swine barns open on Thursday, November 23, 2011, 3:00 p.m.
16. Exhibitors may not sell an entry that was purchased in their name to another exhibitor.
17. No refunds on entries.
18. All points earned at the Fall Classic will be doubled in both the state-wide and regional TJLA point standings.
19. Three pigs to a pen. Please bring dividers to be placed inside the pens if you wish to use them.
20. There will be no changing of names on the weight cards or weights on the weight cards for Ring B.

**Meat Goat Show
Meat Goat Show A
Saturday, November 26, 2011 Immediately
following Official TCMGA Showmanship.
Meat Goat Show B Will Follow Show A**

1. The show is open to any breeds or crossbred goat.
2. Texas exhibitors only. No health papers required.
3. Goats must be exhibited by their owners. The only exception is if the owner has more than one goat in a class or in another division of the show. Substitute exhibitors must be of eligible TJLA age.
4. Any animal exhibited in showmanship must be exhibited by that exhibitor in the regular show.
5. Horns must be tipped.
6. Exhibitors will be allowed to use halters or collars in the show ring.
7. Exhibitors must be members of the TCMGA in order to exhibit in showmanship.
8. Goat exhibitors will turn in weight cards for goats. Goats will be divided by weight classes. There will be Pre-Set Weight Breaks. The weight breaks are as follows:

Class 1 - 64 Lbs and Under
Class 2 - 65-70 Lbs
Class 3 - 71-74 Lbs
Class 4 - 75-78 Lbs
Class 5 - 79-82 Lbs
Class 6 - 83-87 Lbs
Class 7 - 88-92 Lbs
Class 8 - 93-99 Lbs
Class 9 - 100 Lbs and Up

9. Class Champions and Reserve Champions will compete for three Division Champions. There will be a Light Weight Division Champion and Reserve Division Champion, a Medium Weight Division Champion and Reserve Division Champion and a Heavy Weight Division Champion and Reserve Division Champion.
10. We reserve the right to weigh back all animals.
11. Goats must weigh back within three pounds of the weight that was turned in on the weight card. There will be no tolerance other than the three pounds.
12. May exhibit wethers or nannies.
13. A goat must be entered in the first show in order to be entered in the second show. There will be no changing of the weight on the weight card between the first and second show.
14. Exhibitors may not sell an entry that was purchased in their name to another exhibitor.
15. No refunds on entries.
16. All points earned at the Fall Classic will double in both the state wide and regional TJLA point standings.

Cattle Stalling

No Exceptions. Must follow procedure!
Stalling Done on A First Entered- First Stalled Basis

Stalling is one of the most labor intensive functions at the Fall Classic. We can only

accommodate exhibitors if we have a clear understanding of their stalling requests. Any stalling request must be accompanied by entries from everyone in the group that wishes to stall together. We will strictly adhere to this policy. It is impossible to stall individuals together who enter separately and at different times. If you wish to stall a particular place in the barn submit your entries early. The earlier an entry is submitted, the more likely your request will be fulfilled.

Guidelines:

1. You will enter showmanship at the show.
2. Any group which wishes to stall together must send all of their entries in at one time and together. A cover letter should list the exhibitors who wish to stall together and the number of animals that each exhibitor has entered and any other information which you consider pertinent.
3. Entries sent in separately will be stalled separately.
4. Exhibitors who are requesting certain spots in the barn should mail a letter explaining where they wish to be stalled and a diagram which shows the approximate place in the barn.
5. If you are an exhibitor who is stalling outside so that you might use fans directly behind your cattle, please let us know.
6. If you are a purchaser of one of the Five Star Camper spots, you will explain this to the representative from the EXTRACO Events Center when you stop to pay for your camper spots.

Five Star Camper Accommodations

There are 35 camper spots with water and electricity and grass that are conveniently located in a grassy area in back of and to the side of the swine barn. The TJLA will sell the right to utilize one of those prime spots on a first come/ first served basis from the office. Each of the 35 prime trailer spots will be assessed a surcharge of \$100.00 per camper spot. This is a one time fee that is paid for the entire length of the show. It is not a daily fee. This does not relieve the person who pays the surcharge of the responsibility to pay the daily rental on camper spaces to the Heart O' Texas Fair Complex. Everyone wishing to rent a camper space during the Fall Classic must pay the EXTRACO Events Center their rental fee. If you wish to purchase one of the 35 prime spaces, you may pay the \$100.00 to the association. This reserves your space. The first day for sending in money for these spaces is October 1, 2011. We will take reservations for those spots from October 1, 2011 until they are all filled. There will still be plenty of other camper spaces available in other parts of the facility; The EXTRACO Events Center has more than 300 camper spaces all over the fairgrounds. They are rented from the EXTRACO Events Center upon arrival for the show. There will be no reservations for these other spots. They are purchased on a first come/first served basis. Requests for the Five Star Camper spots may be made by sending in the name of the person who wishes to reserve the spot, the number of spots that they wish to reserve and be accompanied by a check for \$100.00 per spot reserved.
